

United States Balance of Trade 1950-2016 | Data | Chart | Calendar

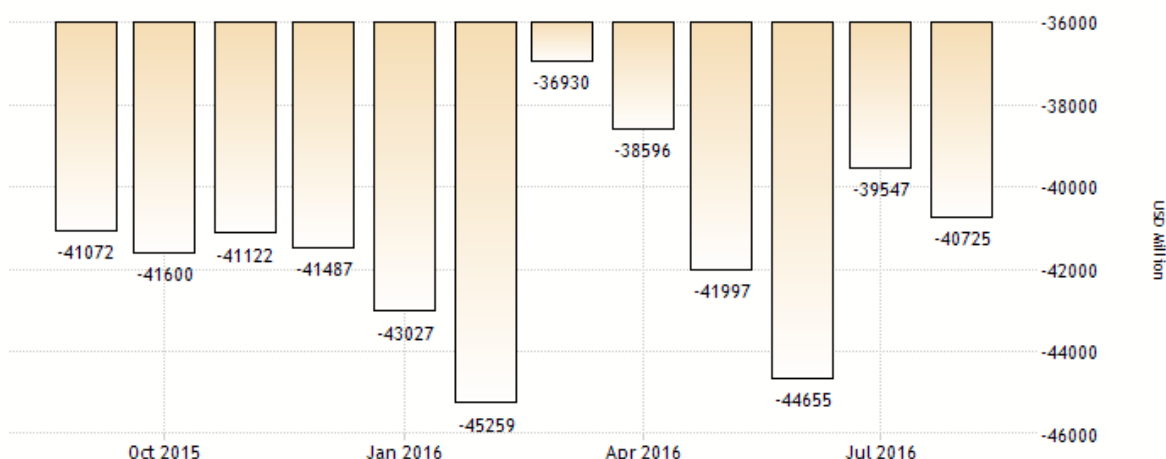
The US goods and services deficit increased 3 percent mom to \$40.73 billion in August of 2016, slightly worse than market expectations of a \$39.3 billion gap. Imports jumped by 1.2 percent to \$228.6 billion, the highest since September last year while exports rose 0.8 percent mom to \$187.9 billion, the highest since July of 2015. Balance of Trade in the United States averaged -13382.68 USD Million from 1950 until 2016, reaching an all time high of 1946 USD Million in June of 1975 and a record low of -67823 USD Million in August of 2006. Balance of Trade in the United States is reported by the U.S. Census Bureau.
