



Obama blames Nixon for NOAA

We still have Richard Nixon (http://www.politico.com/tag/richardNixon) to kick around, it seems.

President Barack Obama
(http://www.politico.com/tag/BarackObama), in
announcing a restructuring proposal
(http://www.politico.com/news/stories
/0112/71409.html) for the federal government,
took a shot at a predecessor, President
Nixon — blaming him for the inefficient
placement of the National Oceanic and

Atmospheric Administration (http://www.politico.com/tag/NationalOceanicandAtmosphericAdministration) within the Commerce Department.

"If you're wondering what the genesis of this was apparently, this had something to do with President Nixon being unhappy with his Interior Secretary for criticizing the Vietnam War. So he decided not to put NOAA in what would have been a more sensible place," Obama said in remarks today.

Part of his reorganization would move NOAA from Commerce (http://www.politico.com/tag/CommerceDepartment) to the Interior Department (http://www.politico.com/tag/departmentofinterior).
