

Attkisson: Hacking Software Was from FBI, CIA, DIA or NSA

Former CBS investigative reporter Sharyl Attkisson alleges in her new book, "Stonewalled," that both her personal and work computers were hacked over a lengthy period of time by someone in the government.

Attkisson Claims CBS Banned Her From Ingraham's Radio Show

On <u>"The O'Reilly Factor"</u> tonight, Attkisson said that she received inside information from government-connected sources that she had been hacked.

She contacted a computer forensics expert, who concluded that sophisticated intrusions had taken place, and the proprietary software on her computers was a type used by either the FBI, CIA, DIA or NSA, four government agencies.

Other experts and even a consultant hired by CBS later confirmed both the extent and sophistication of the hacking.

O'Reilly said the only way we'll ever find out who accessed her computers is if a whistleblower comes forward, but Attkisson said there have been recent developments, and there might be other ways to get to the bottom of the hacking.

"I have a whole team, basically, that's been working on this for some time that includes some of my sources, the computer forensics folks and my attorney," Attkisson explained.
