



#### Outlays by Category, 1970 to 2020






## Outlays for Some Key Federal Programs Will Exceed Total Federal Revenues Under "Current Policy"

Figures are shown net of offsetting receipts where relevant and include the effects of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.








#### **Sources of Growth in Mandatory Spending**






#### Aging Population: Population 65+ as a Share of the Population Ages 20 to 64






# Factors Explaining Future Federal Spending on Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security






#### Projected Spending for Medicare, Parts A and B
