## Partisan composition of state houses

The **partisan composition of state houses** refers to which party holds the majority of seats in the state house or the lower level of each state legislature. Altogether, in the 49 state houses, there are 5,411 state representatives.

The breakdown of chamber control after the November 2018 election is as follows:

- 19 chambers
- **6** 29 chambers
- 1 chamber with power sharing between the parties

The breakdown of chamber control prior to the November 2018 election was as follows:

- ● 18 chambers
- 31 chambers

#### **Ties**

A total of 61 state legislative chambers around the country have an even number of members, raising the possibility of a tie between the two major parties. In some instances, a bipartisan coalition of legislators is formed to act as leadership. This tactic has not been the universal

approach, however; some legislative bodies have used a coin toss, gubernatorial choice, shared time, or dividing chairperson positions between the parties.<sup>[1]</sup>

As of October 2019, 61 chambers were under GOP control, while Democrats held majorities in 37 chambers.<sup>[3]</sup> A power sharing agreement was established between Democrats and Republicans in one chamber.
