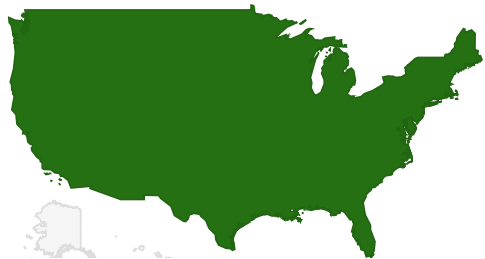
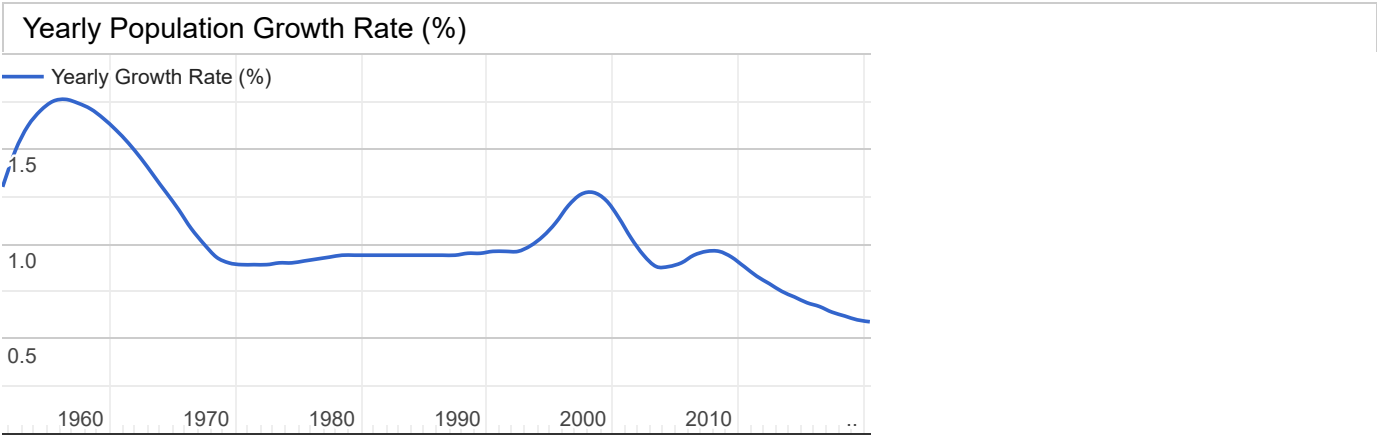
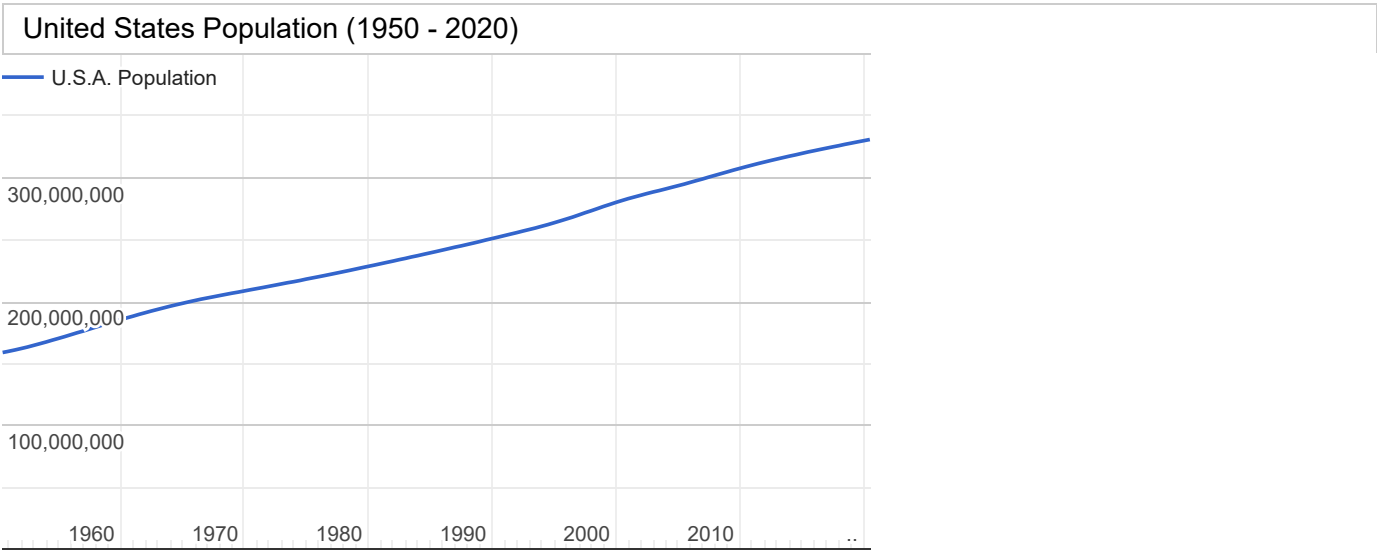

# United States Population (LIVE)

# 331,487,857



- The current population of **the United States of America** is **331,478,677** as of Tuesday, September 29, 2020, based on Worldometer elaboration of the latest United Nations data.
- The United States 2020 population is estimated at **331,002,651** people at mid year according to UN data.
- The United States population is equivalent to **4.25%** of the [total world population \(/world-population/\)](#).
- The U.S.A. ranks number **3** in the list of [countries \(and dependencies\) by population \(/world-population/population-by-country/\)](#).
- The population density in the United States is 36 per Km<sup>2</sup> (94 people per mi<sup>2</sup>).
- The total **land** area is 9,147,420 Km<sup>2</sup> (3,531,837 sq. miles)
- **82.8 %** of the population is **urban** (273,975,139 people in 2020)
- The **median age** in the United States is **38.3 years**.

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## Notes

The **United States Population (Live)** counter shows a continuously updated estimate of the current population of the United States of America delivered by [Worldometer's RTS algorithm \(/licensing/what/\)](/licensing/what/), which processes data collected from the United Nations Population Division.

The **Population of the United States (1950 - 2019)** chart plots the total population count as of July 1 of each year, from 1950 to 2019.

The **Yearly Population Growth Rate** chart plots the annual percentage changes in population registered on July 1 of each year, from 1951 to 2019. This value can differ from the *Yearly % Change* shown in the historical table, which shows the last year equivalent percentage change assuming homogeneous change in the preceding five year period.

## Definitions

**Year:** as of July 1 of the year indicated.

**Population:** Overall total population (both sexes and all ages) in the country as of July 1 of the year indicated, as estimated by the United Nations, Department of Economic and Social Affairs, Population Division. [World Population Prospects: The 2019 Revision \(https://esa.un.org/unpd/wpp/\)](https://esa.un.org/unpd/wpp/). For forecasted years, the U.N. medium-fertility variant is



used.
